Exhibit 1 Refurbished crosswalk at First Street and Swift Street


Exhibit 2 Refurbished crosswalk at First Street and Main Street

The original request was a crosswalk where the parking lot driveway enters First Street. This request does not comply with current City crosswalk policy. The site of Exhibit 3 was offered as an alternative, but not acted upon. Council directed the existing crosswalks to be refurbished and "Children at Play" signs installed. This has been done. Council also directed staff to wait and assess the situation. To date, there have been no comments provided to the Administration.

Attached is a site map showing 1032 Cherokee Road abutting the city park. There has been an inquiry asking if the City would be interested in selling a portion of the park to provide a larger lot for the house.
