## Sewer mains on old Perry outfall Ball, Jernigan, and Washington Streets.

ESG has notified the city of failures in this area of the City's sewer system. GWES has completed prioritization of pipes and begun to plan for project bidding for repairs. Project is on hold until direction from City manager or Council. This project is included with GEFA application list.



# Tucker Road Water Treatment Facility

This facility needs an onsite generator. ESG and staff working with generator consultant for options. City has received quotes. quotes also cover a generator at the Hwy 341 well.

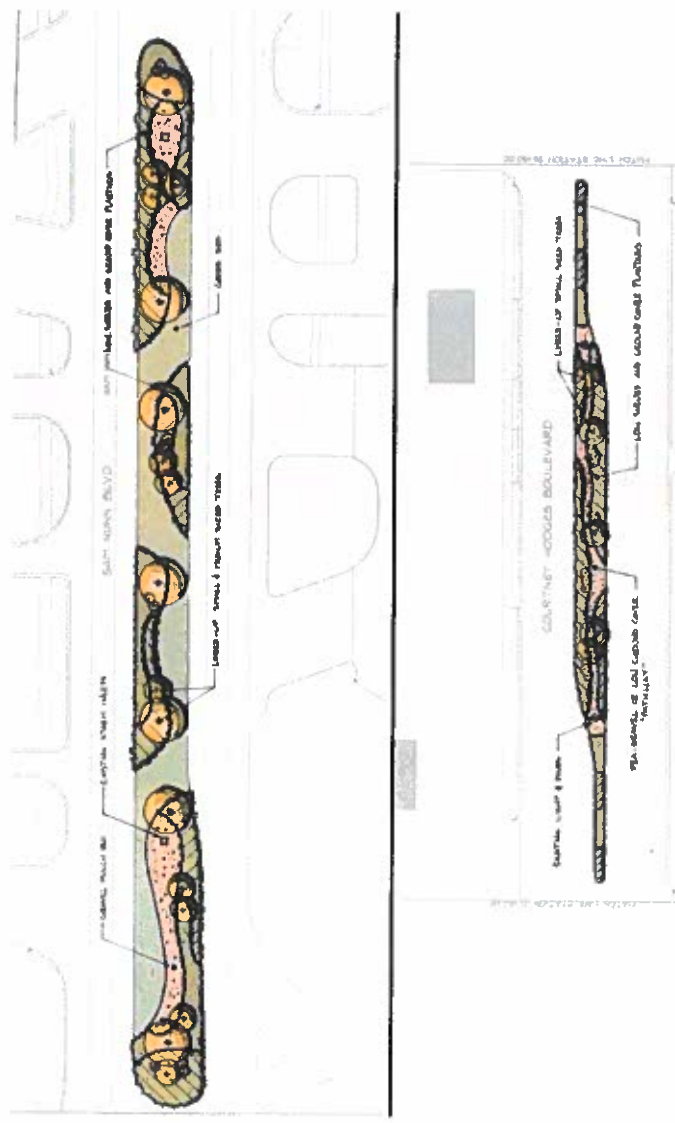
# Water Plant #2 Woodlawn Drive improvements to electrical

The City has established what action will be required to complete the regional pond. The regional pond is split by private property owners.

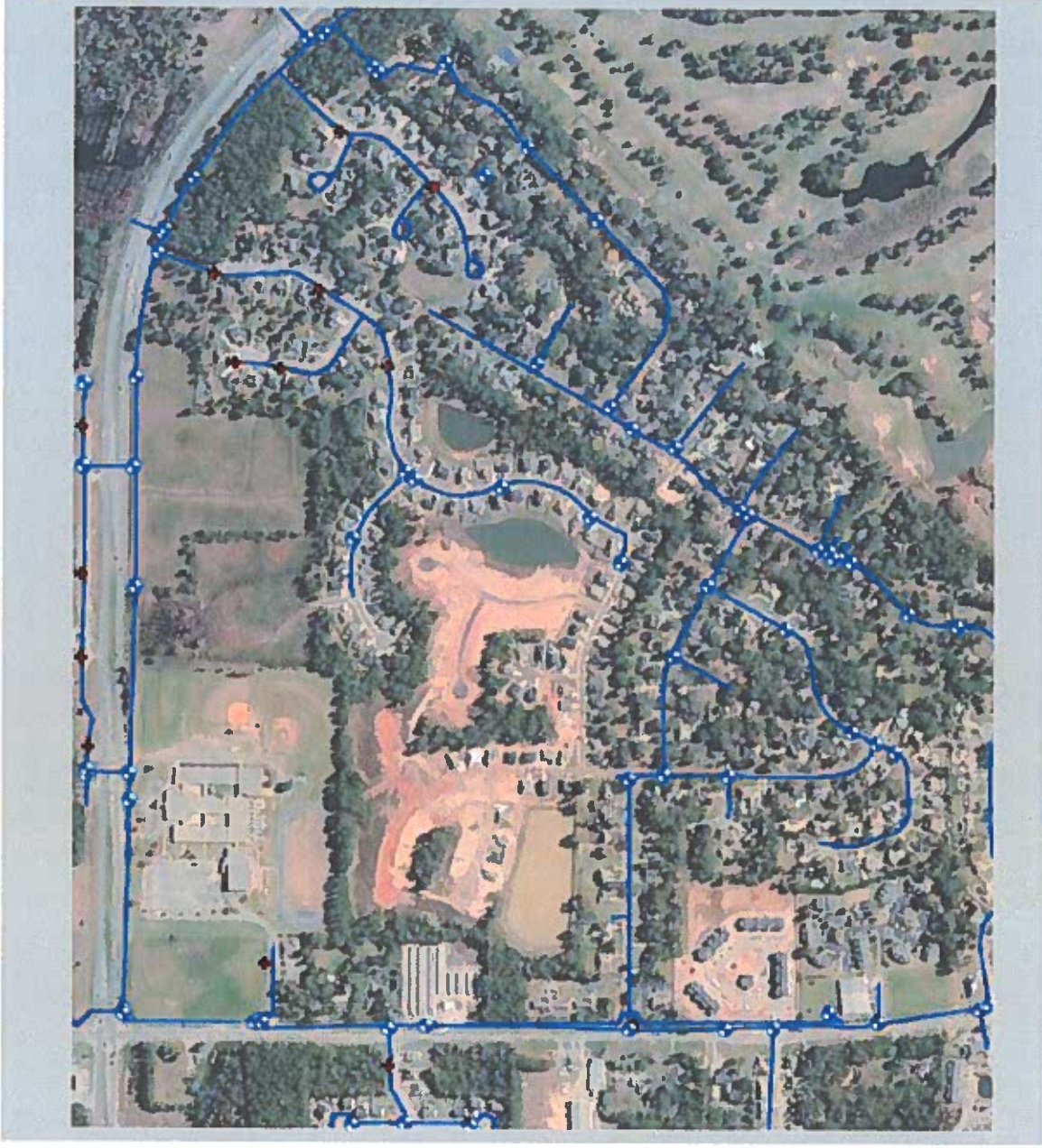
Staff is working to obtain property. Pond designs have been sent to Kimley-Horn consultant for review and recommendations.

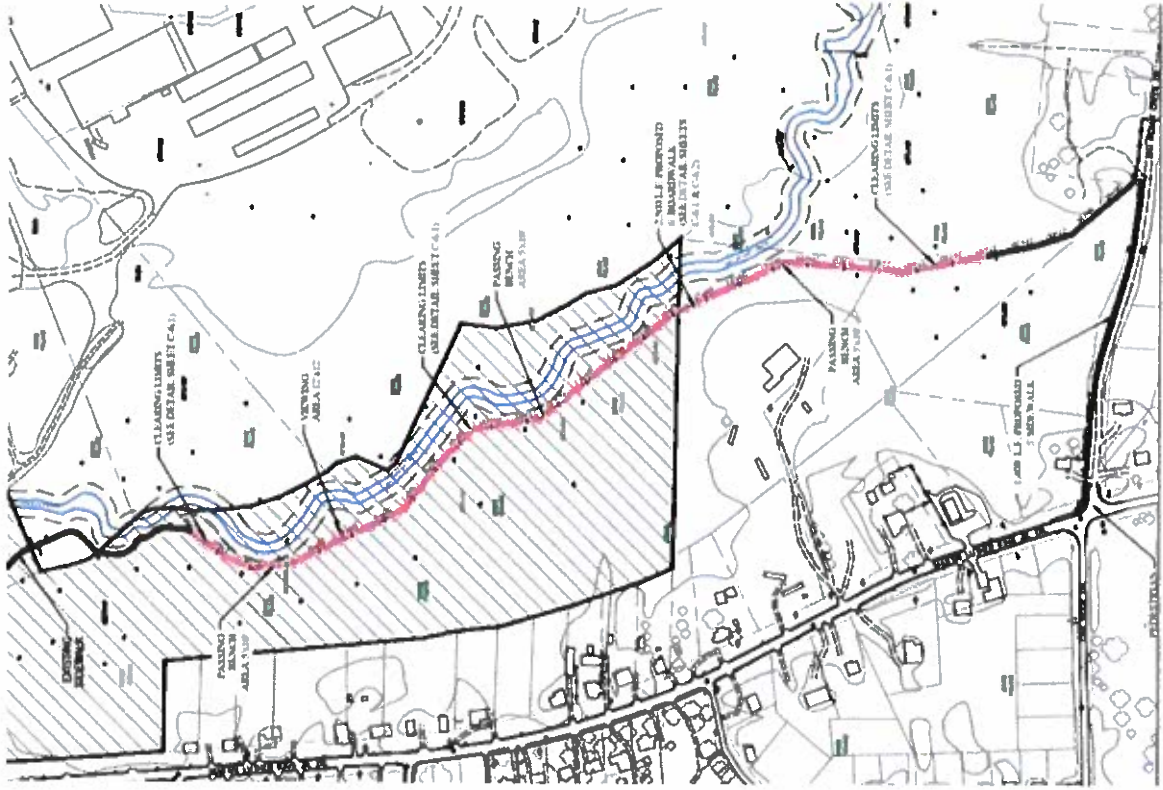

- Sidewalk Connectivity mapping has been added to GIS.



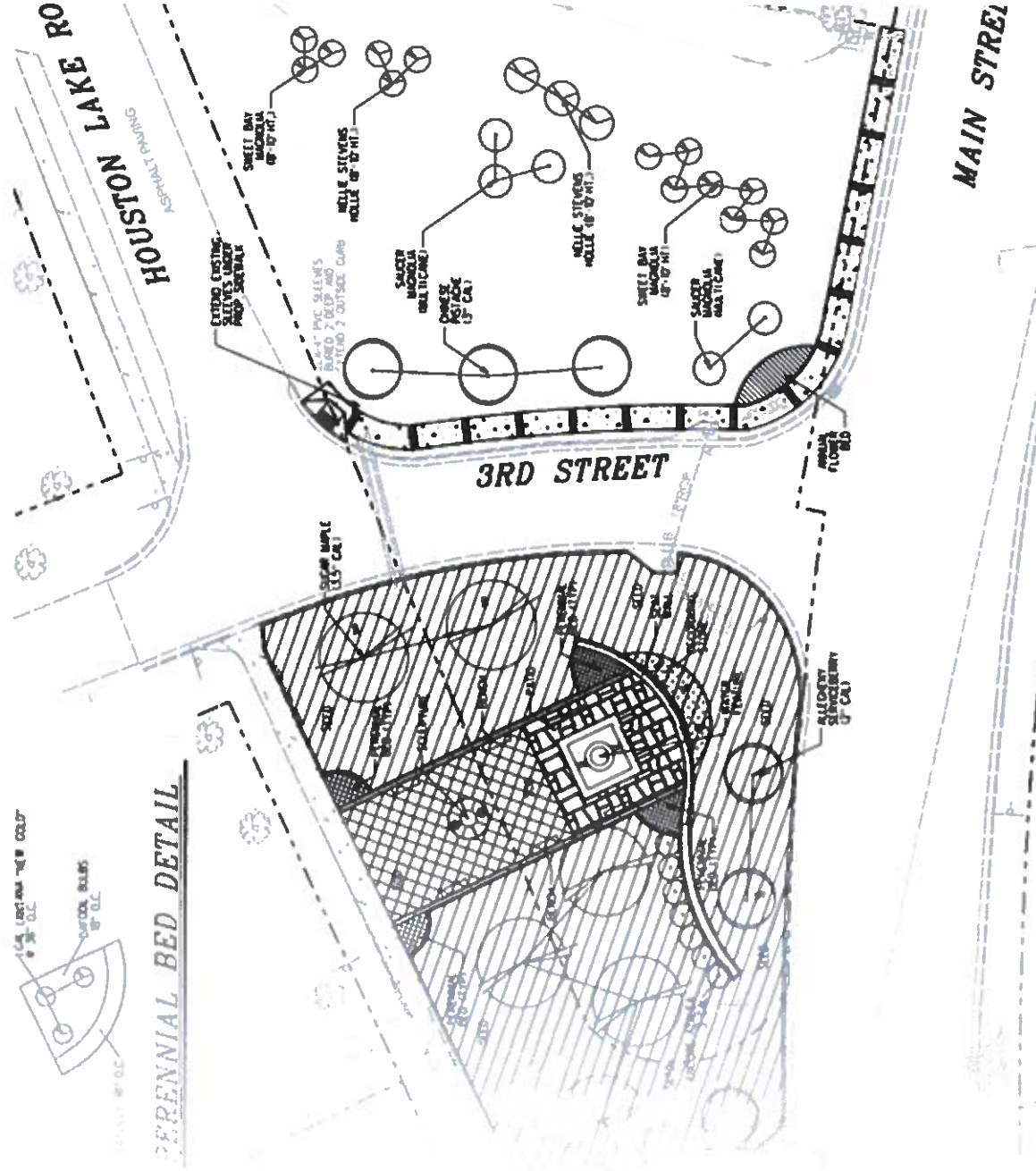
# Big Indian Creek walking trail Weleetka extension

# Crossroads Park at 3rd Street

Ansley and Rick Saunders have been refining the park design since grading behind the Church is complete. – Next phase is in Design with Rick Saunders and Annsley. – Project bidding is pending final detail. (water feature)





# Heritage Park and Legacy Park

Construction is complete NOI still pending with State. Park Punchlist complete.

- Storm water and erosion issues have been severe with recent rain events. (EPD complaint) City has followed up soil stabilization. Final repair work to the pond will be scheduled. (no date from Parrish yet)

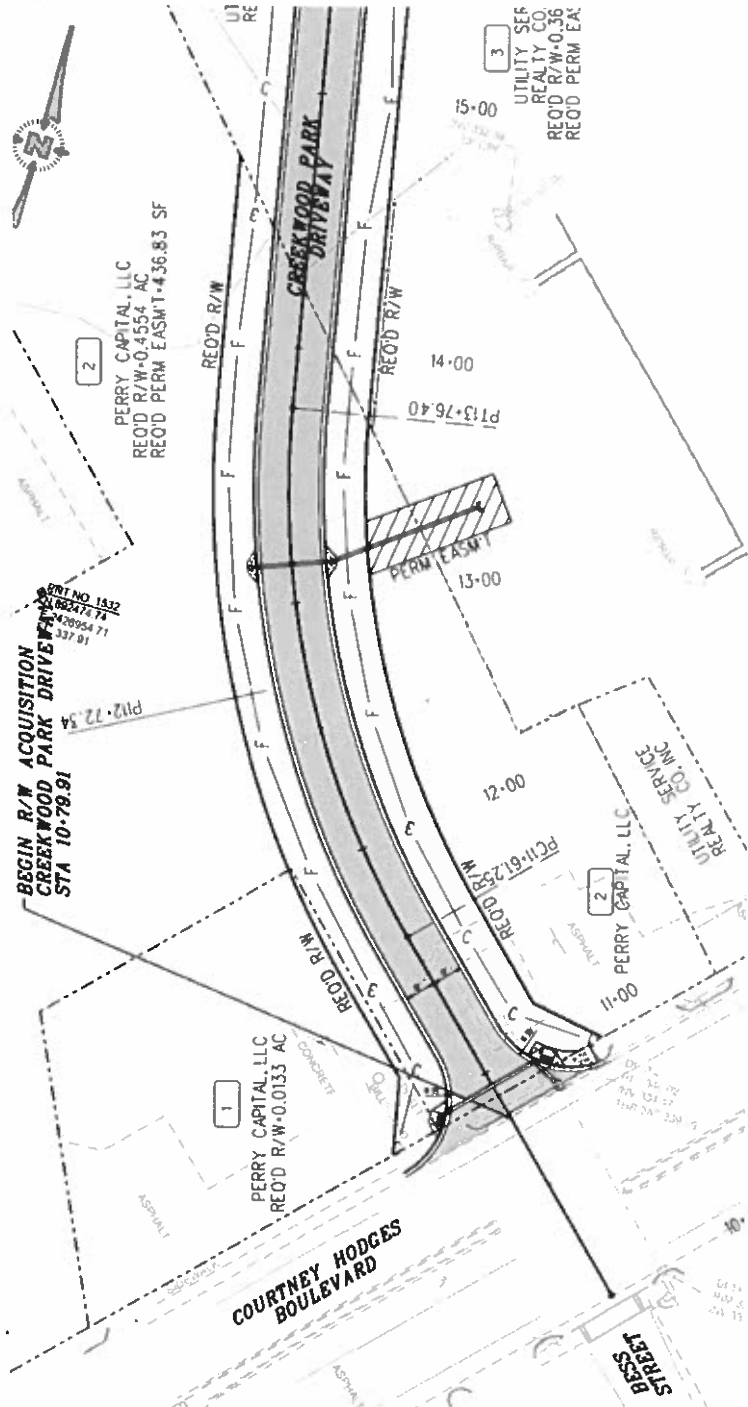

# Houston County – Lake Joy Road widening project

- Natural Gas line has been relocated by ESG and Contractor. Houston County project is in progress.
- Developer has approached the City about extending Lake Joy across Houston Lake Road. Concept concerns were commented and sent back to engineer.



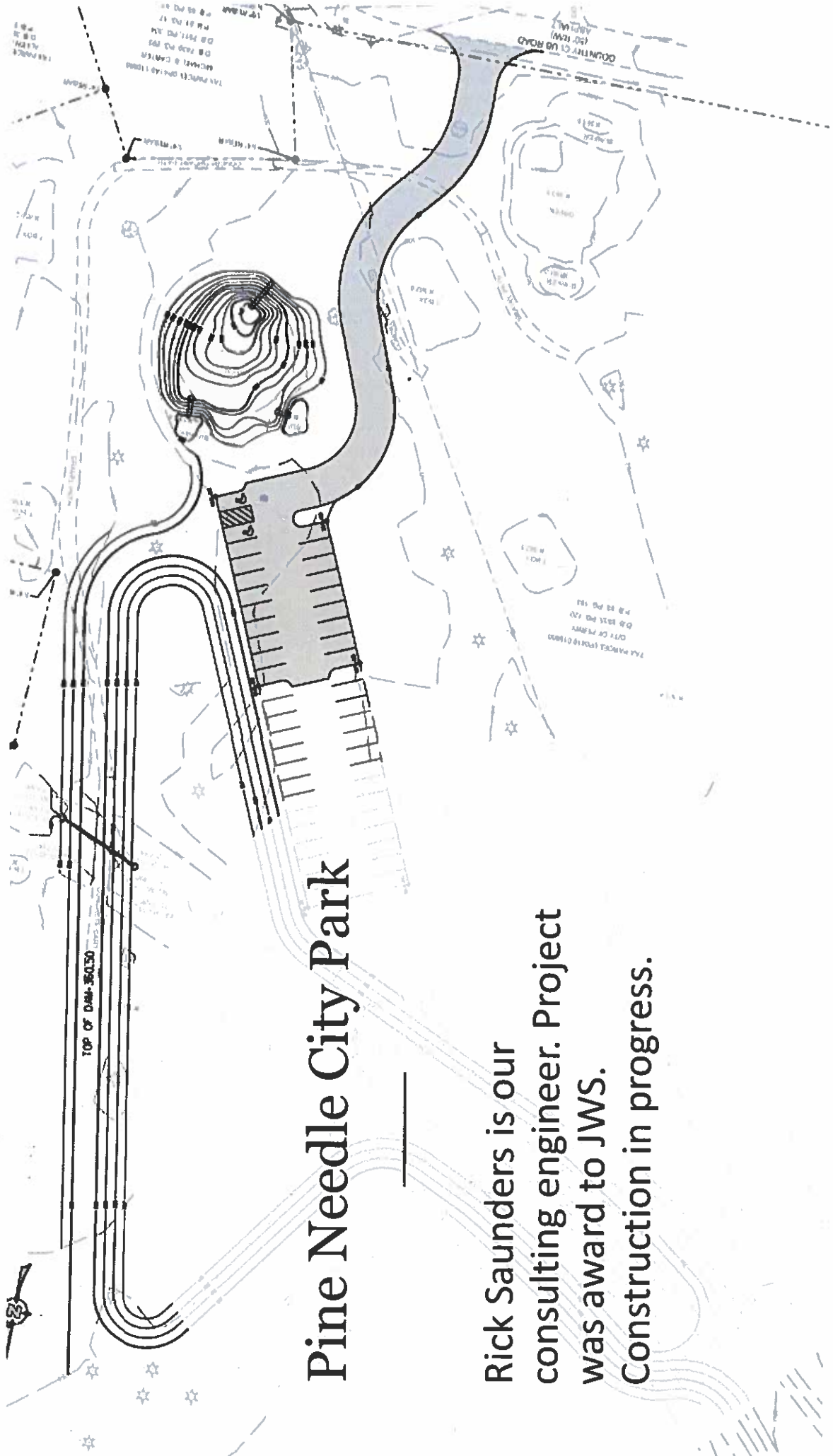
## Houston County Widening Project –HWY 127 / Houston Lake road from Perry Parkway to Kings Chapel Road. Water, Gas main relocation, and Sidewalk construction.

- Robinson Contractor is the low bidder on this project. GA Power is installing power poles. Poles will also serve a GDOT traffic signal at Kings Chapel and Houston Lake Road.
- Storm Pipes under Hwy 127 (Houston Lake) at Kings Chapel have been lined by GDOT. The city has the remaining portion. We have reached out for pricing with UAM.
- GWES is our consulting engineer for water relocation.
- Keck and Wood is our consulting engineer for Gas relocation.
- Rick Saunders is our consulting engineer for sidewalk installation

GWES has finalized designs plans Phase 1A. Project awarded to Don Hall and Sons. Project has begun.





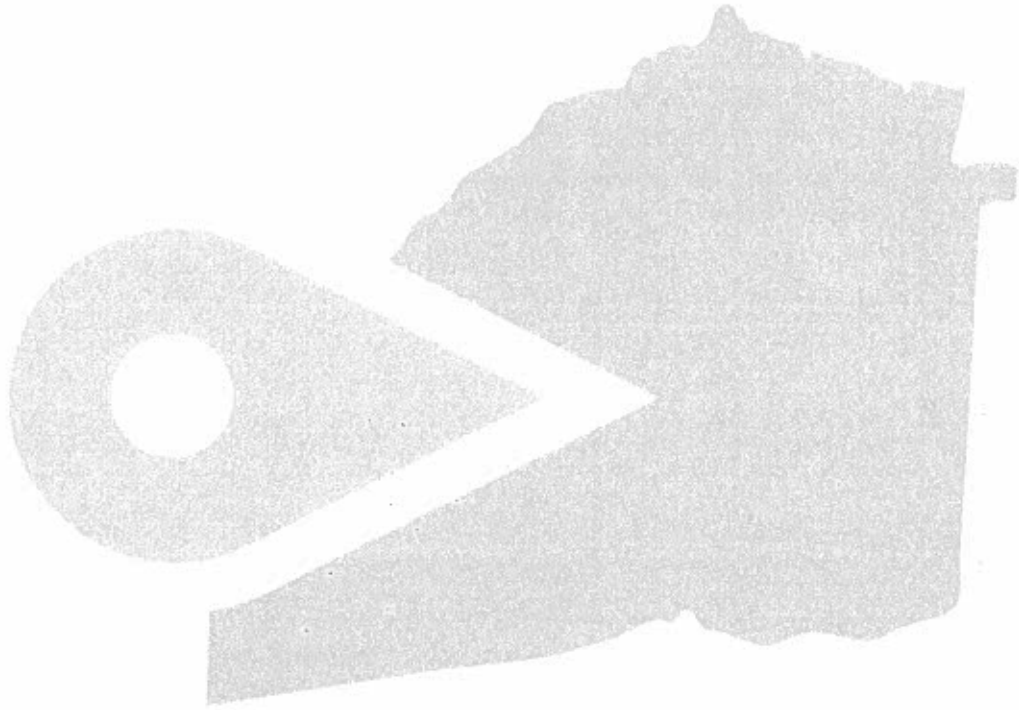
# Pine Needle City Park

GWES prepared a proposal for professional service to engineer replacement of several old asbestos water mains (installed around 1945). Staff prioritizing. On hold until direction from administration.

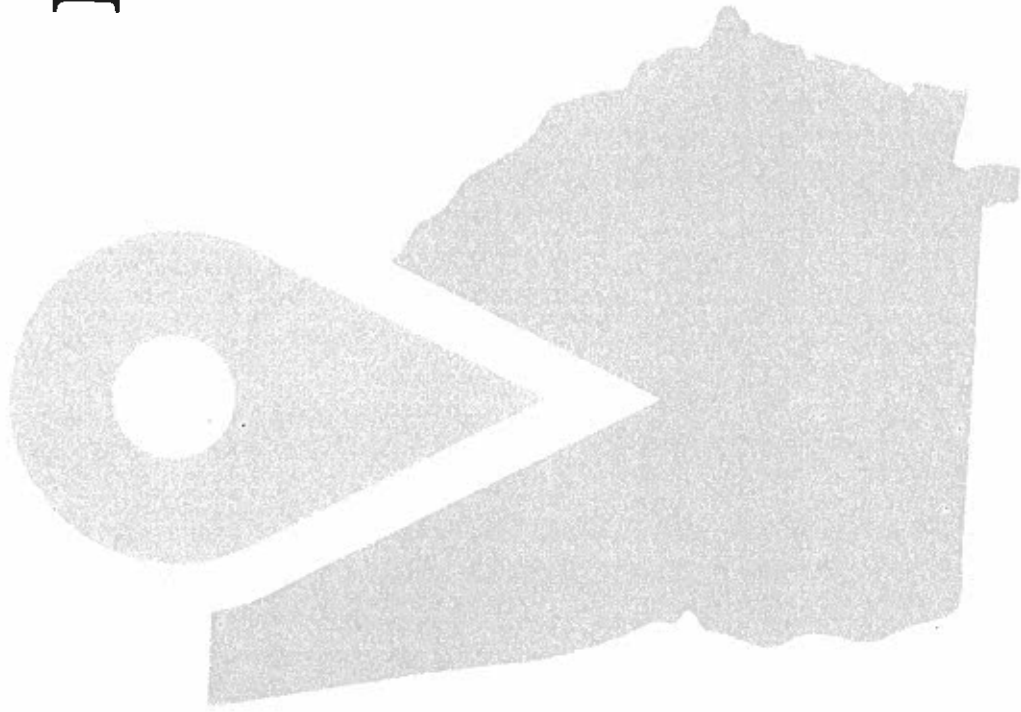




# Georgia Ave. Asbestos Water Main

GWES is our design consulting engineer for replacement of asbestos water main at this location. Bid recommend award 5-4-21 to TMT, contract is pending start date.



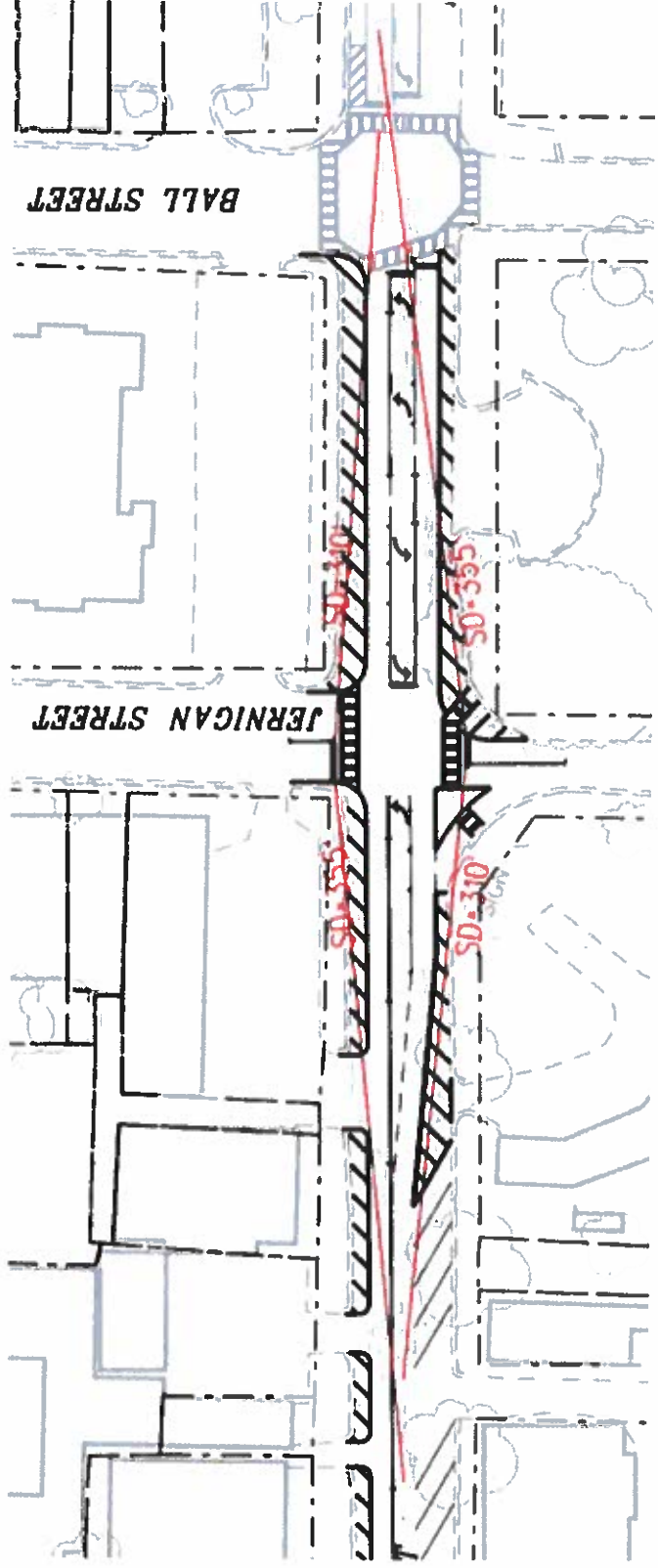


# Map scanning to PDF

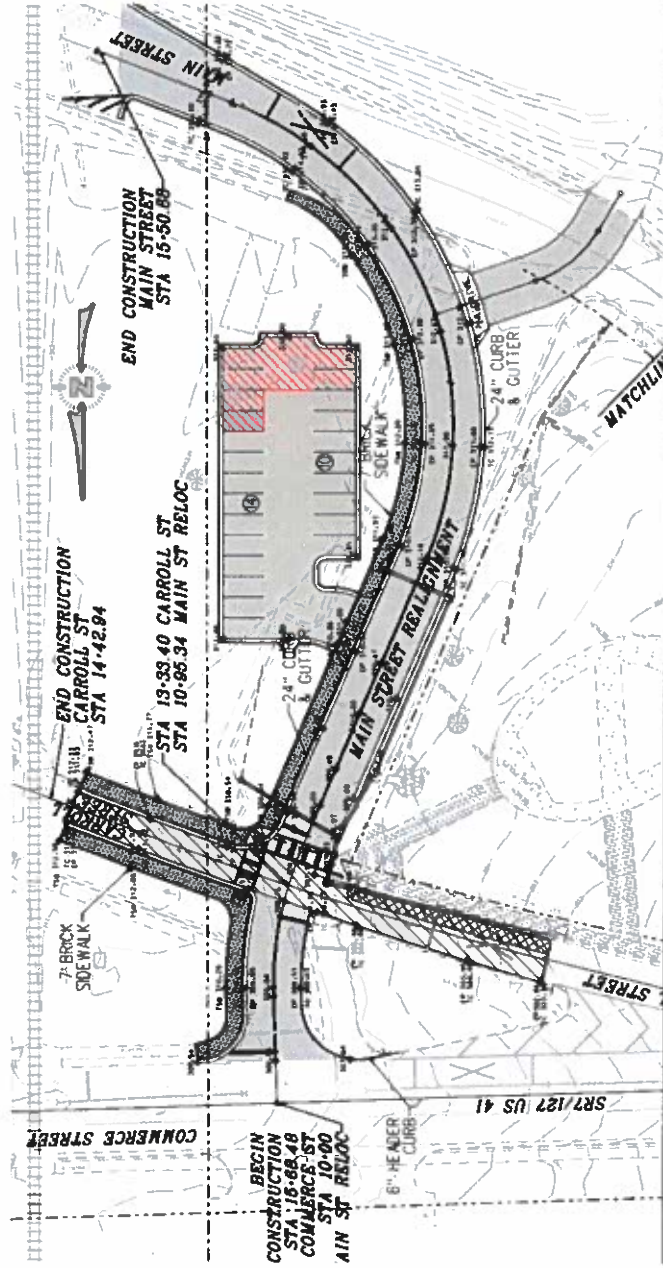
# Crosswalk restriping Main Street/Jernigan and Carroll/Jernigan

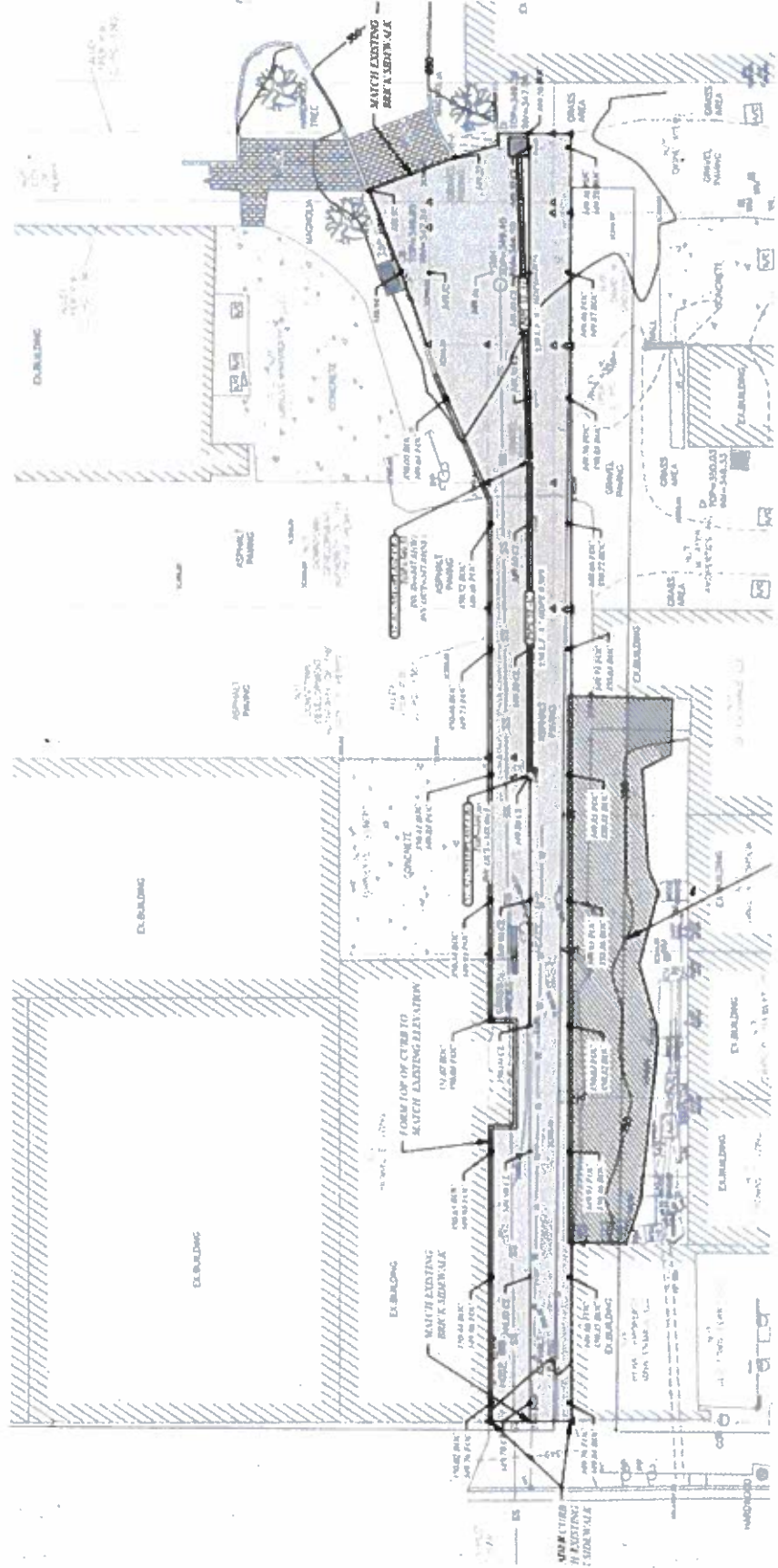
## Stormwater culvert pipe failing on Valley Drive

# Carroll Street Alley

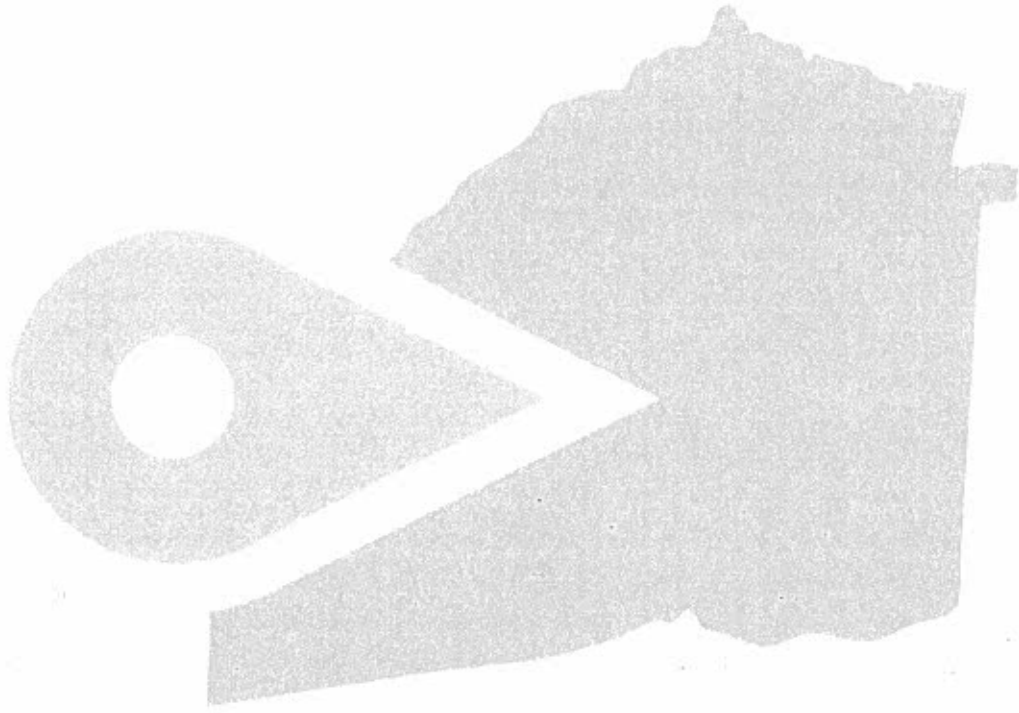
Bryant Engineering has completed redesign of Carroll Street Alley between the 900 block of Carroll and Commerce for stormwater runoff improvements. Probable cost is 200K project is on hold. - Carroll alley is under construction with a new fire water line and new in-fill development project at 904 Commerce.



# 904 Commerce Street

Commerce street infill development project began in March 2021. This project will take several months.





## Way Finding Signage

For signs inside GDOT rights of way. Staff has completed meeting with GDOT. All 4 site are complete by Jones Surveying. GDOT requires details. GPASS technical difficulties working through application process.

# Tucker Road Storm Culvert

GWES is our consulting engineer working to evaluate and design Culvert replacement or repair. Property owner Thomas Mason has expressed concerns for his pond downstream.

Project has been awarded to LaClay construction pending signed contracts and possible change order due to downstream property owner concern, will likely begin in summer 2021 (weather permitting)



# Thompson Road Water and Sewer Extension

GWES is our consulting engineer for this project. Project awarded to Pyles plumbing. Project is near completion. Close out documents.



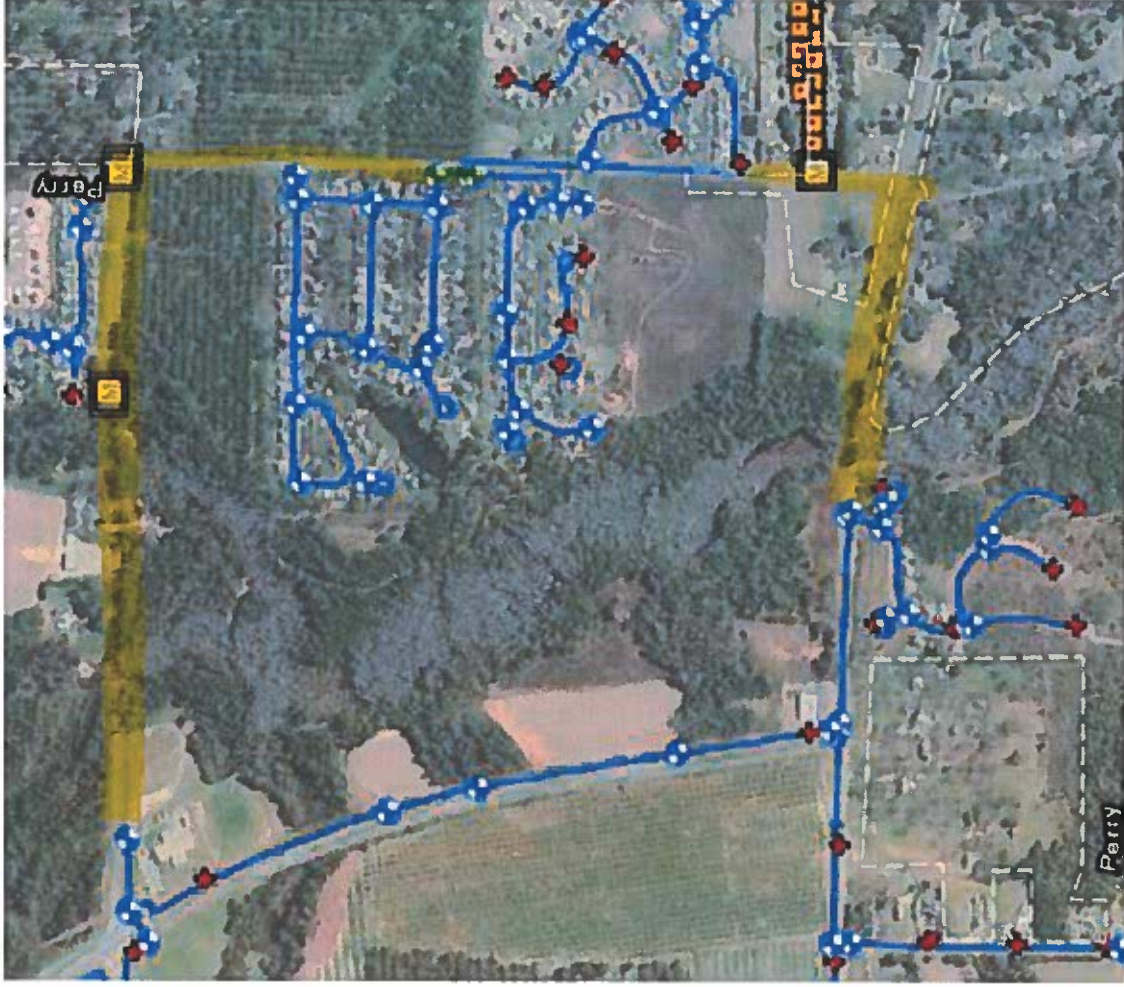
# Water Booster pump assessment for Airport Road

Working with GWES a recommendation of options to increase Water pressure on Airport Road out to the Airport and The Farm Subdivision. Engineering proposal has been submitted to the city. This project was added to the GEFA application list.



## City water extensions to County supplied Subdivisions on Gurr Road.

GWES will provide design for extension of City water mains to a subdivision on Gurr Road. Options presented at the Jan. 13, 2020, work session. Project is On Hold. County and City have discussed possible future water connections.

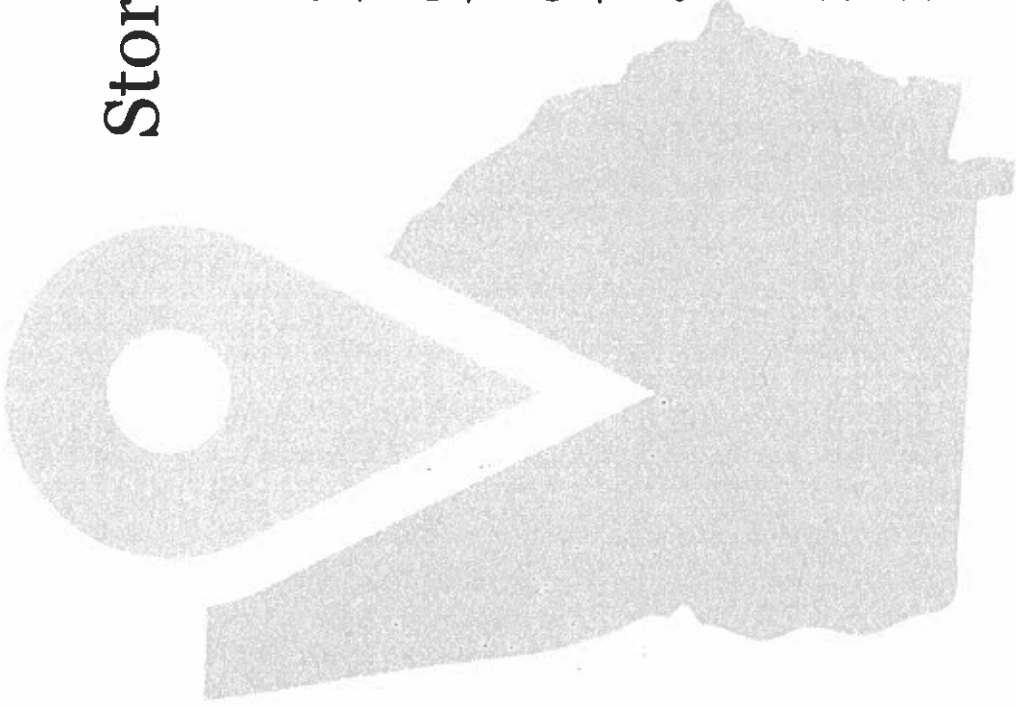


# Stormwater utility fee Calculations

Staff is working to review all stormwater utility fees. Sarah Nottingham is the contact for Stormwater fee calculations. We have calculated time required to complete a new stormwater fee. Average time is calculated to be approximately 10 accounts per day for new accounts.

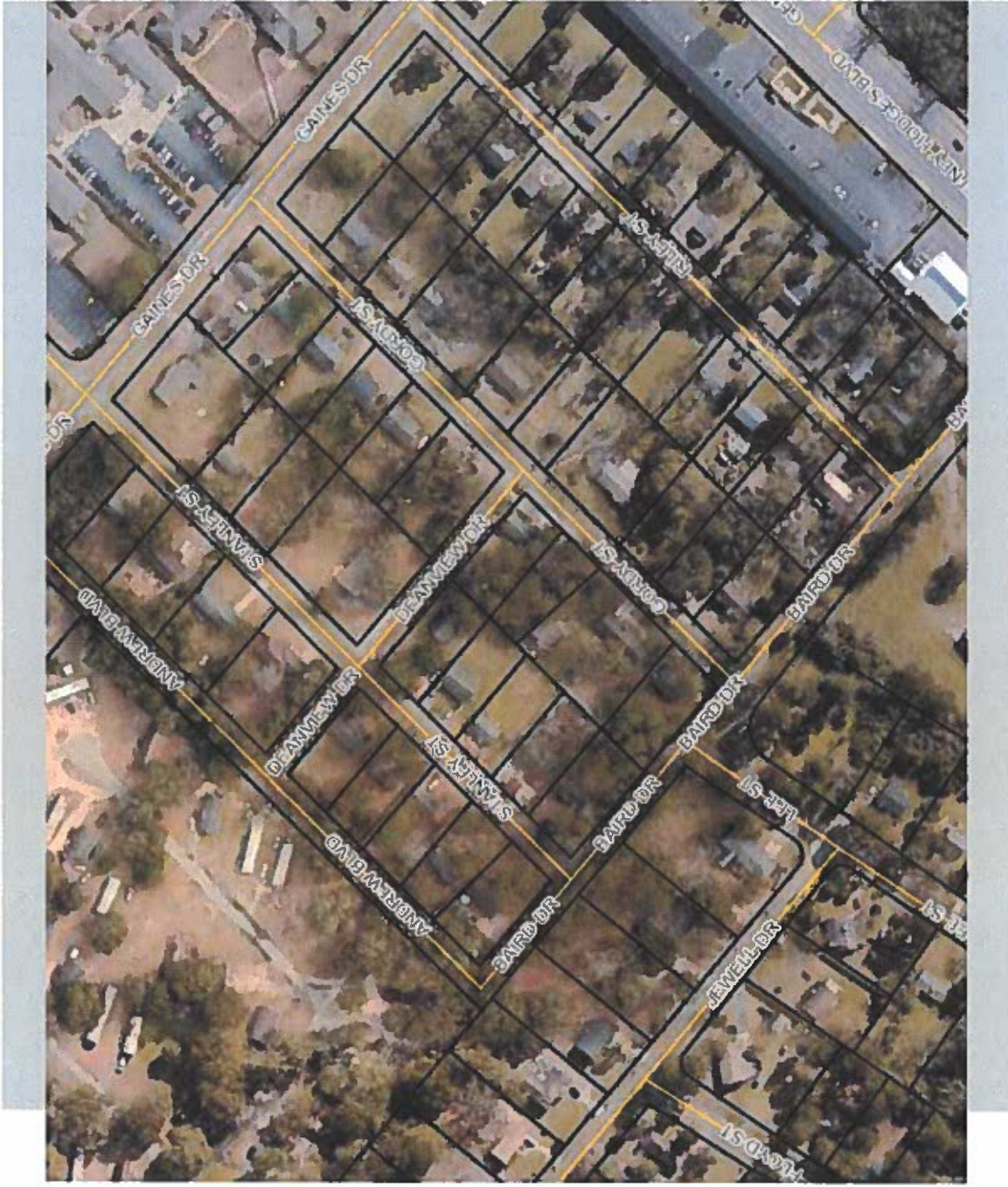

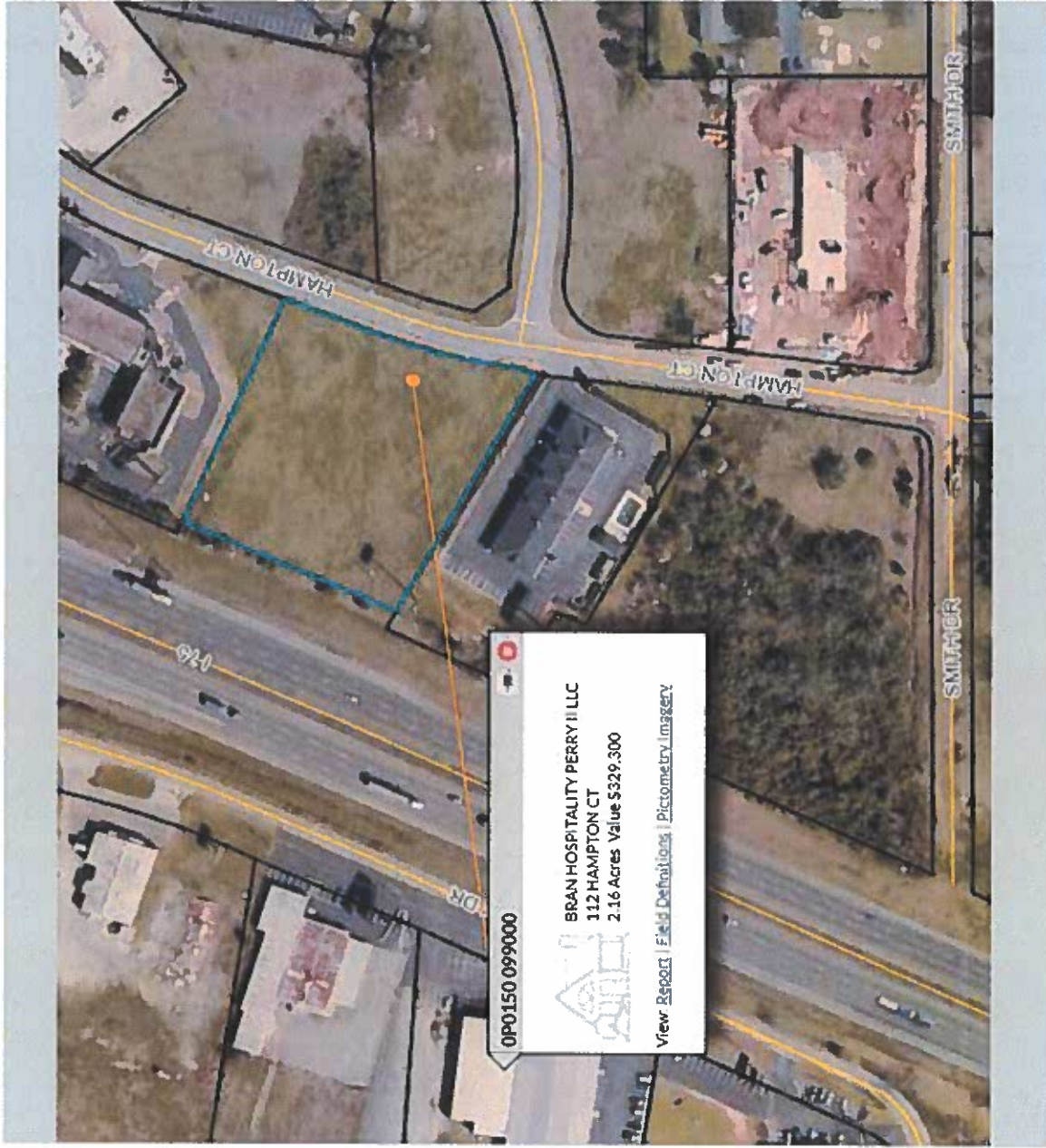

The City and GWES is working on plans to extend water and sewer to the property line. Project construction is nearing completion.





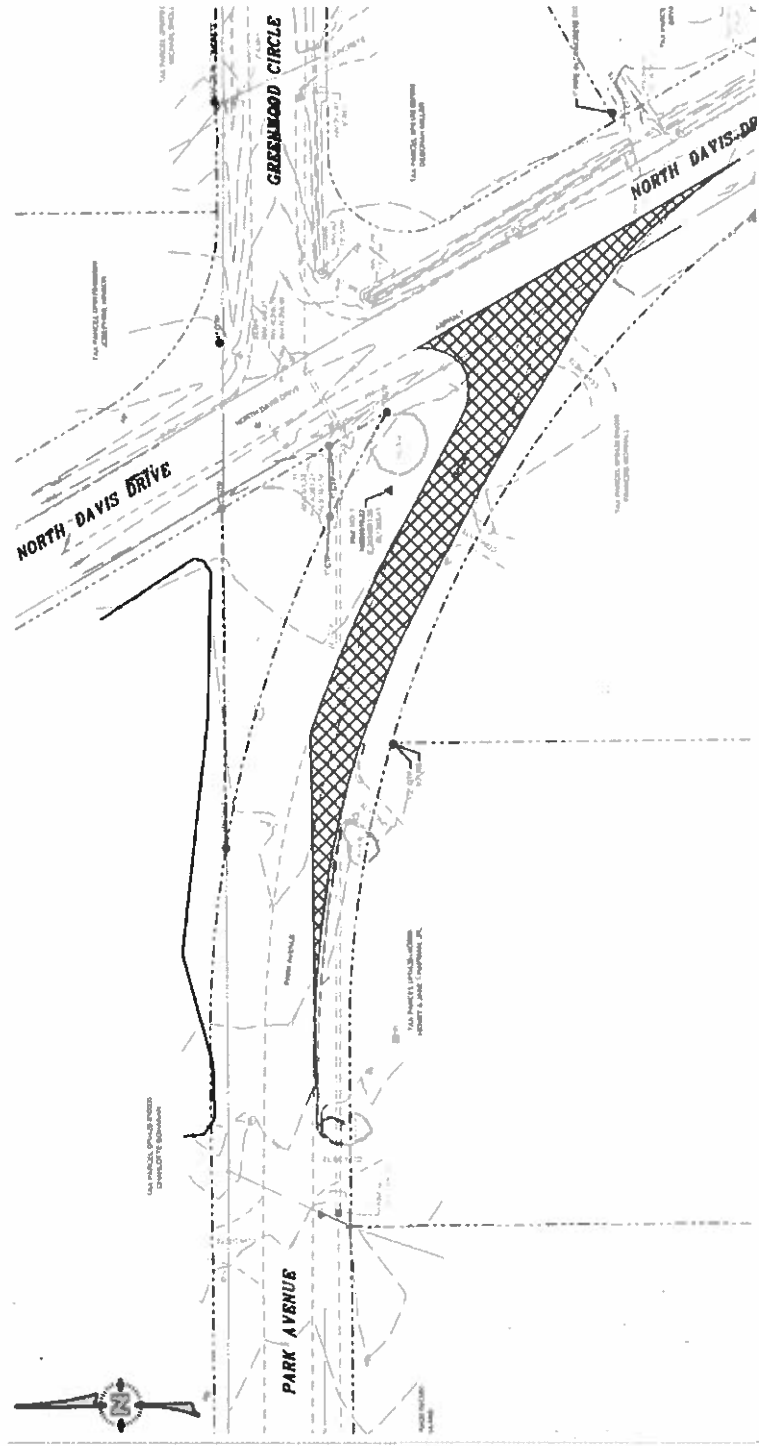
# Langston Road Extension

The City is working with the County and Rick Saunders to design Langston Road extension. Concept design have been submitted.



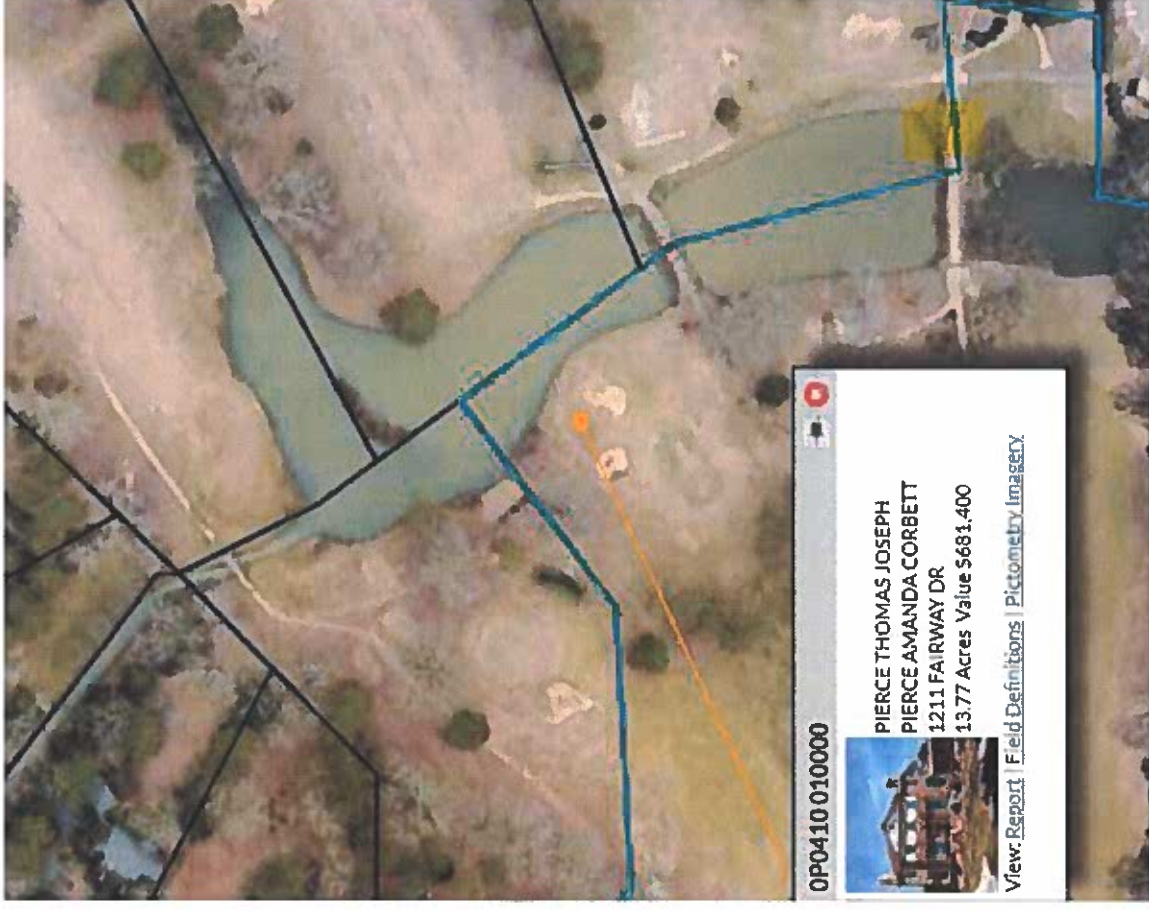
# Intersection of Park and North Davis Drive

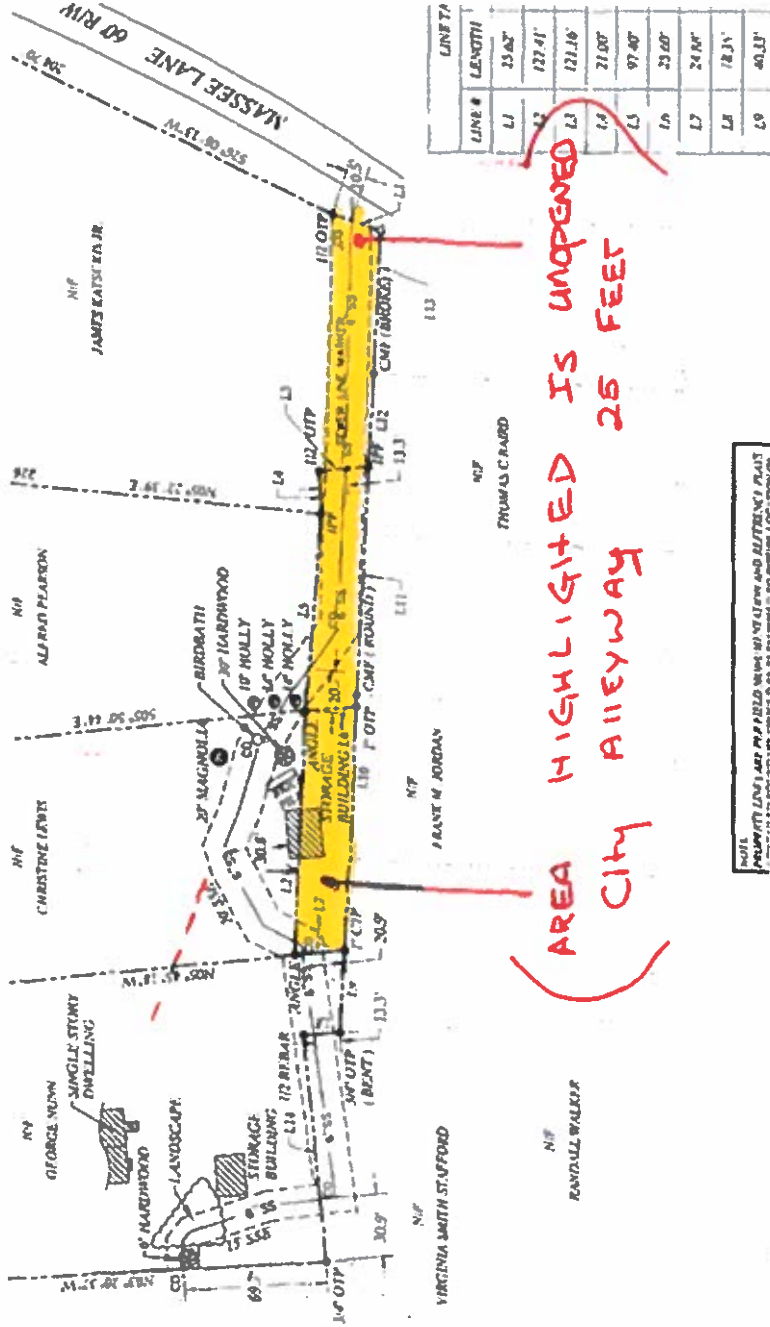
# Northside Drive Flood Evaluation

City and ESG staff are working to relocate sewer back into R/W behind lots off Beckham Circle. Letter have been sent project is now with ESG.



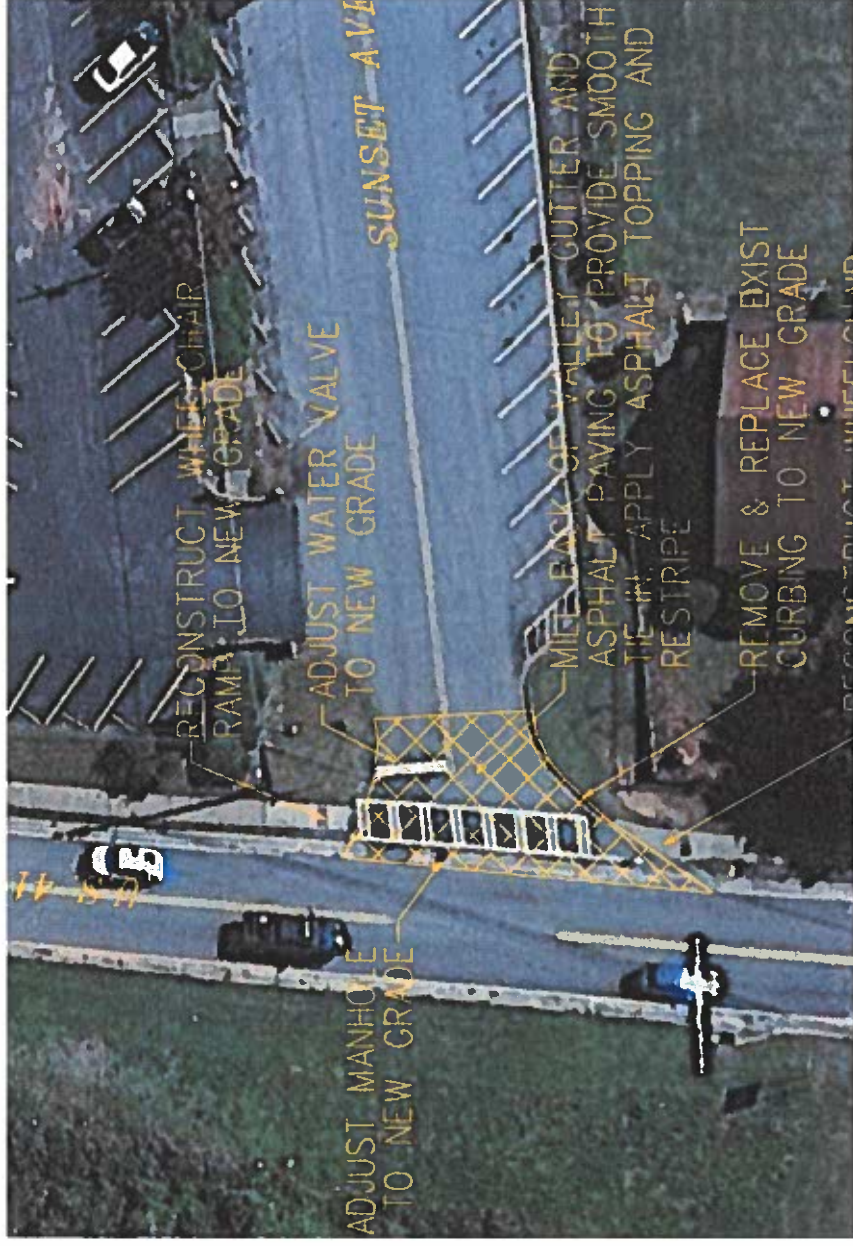
# **GDOT Courtney Hodges Bridge**

# Natural GAS at demand Reames concrete

City and Keck and Wood are reviewing GAS supply and demand for Reames concrete / asphalt. We have confirmed The city can meet demands. We are now awaiting cost approval of Gas meter and High-Pressure regulators could be 60K.

- City Staff and GWES consultant will be reviewing this site for sewer consolidation of pump stations, regional stormwater, traffic, and looping water.



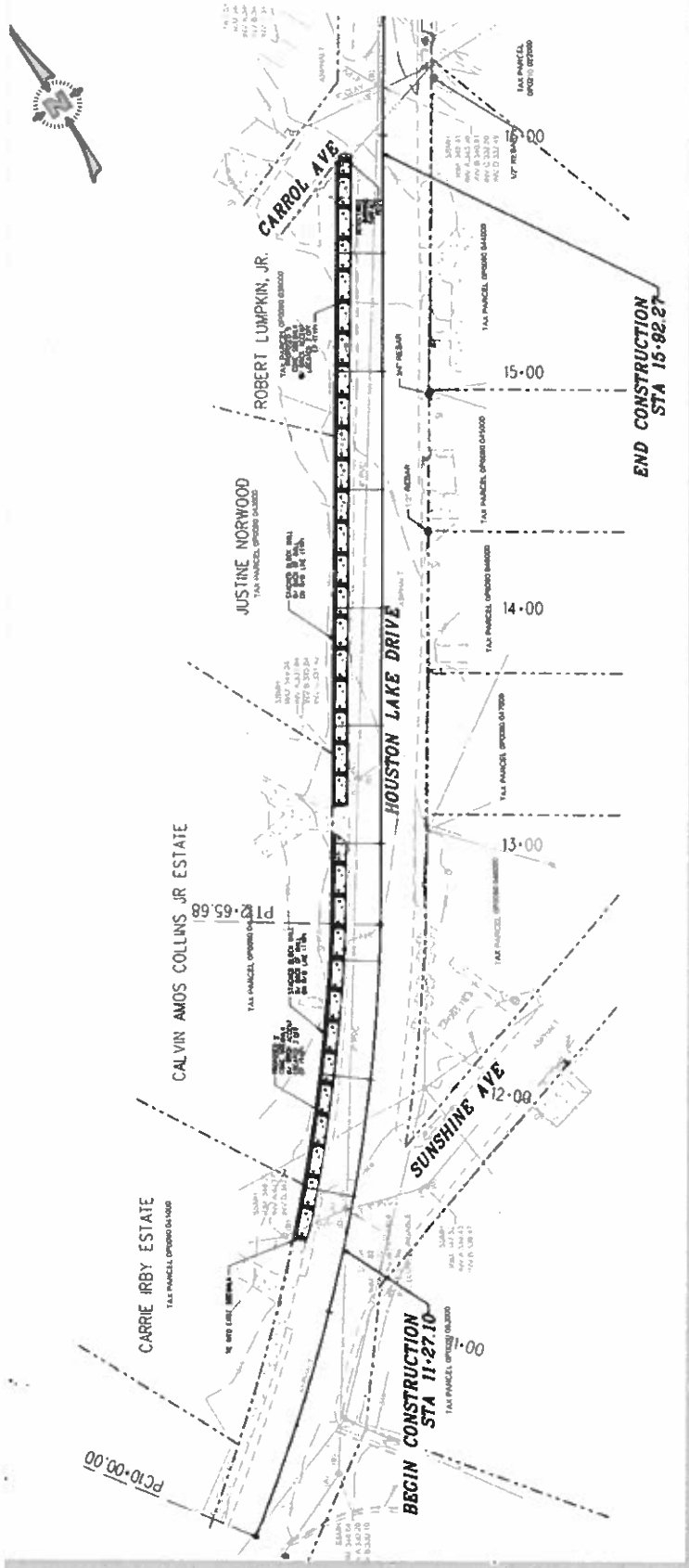
# New Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP) site

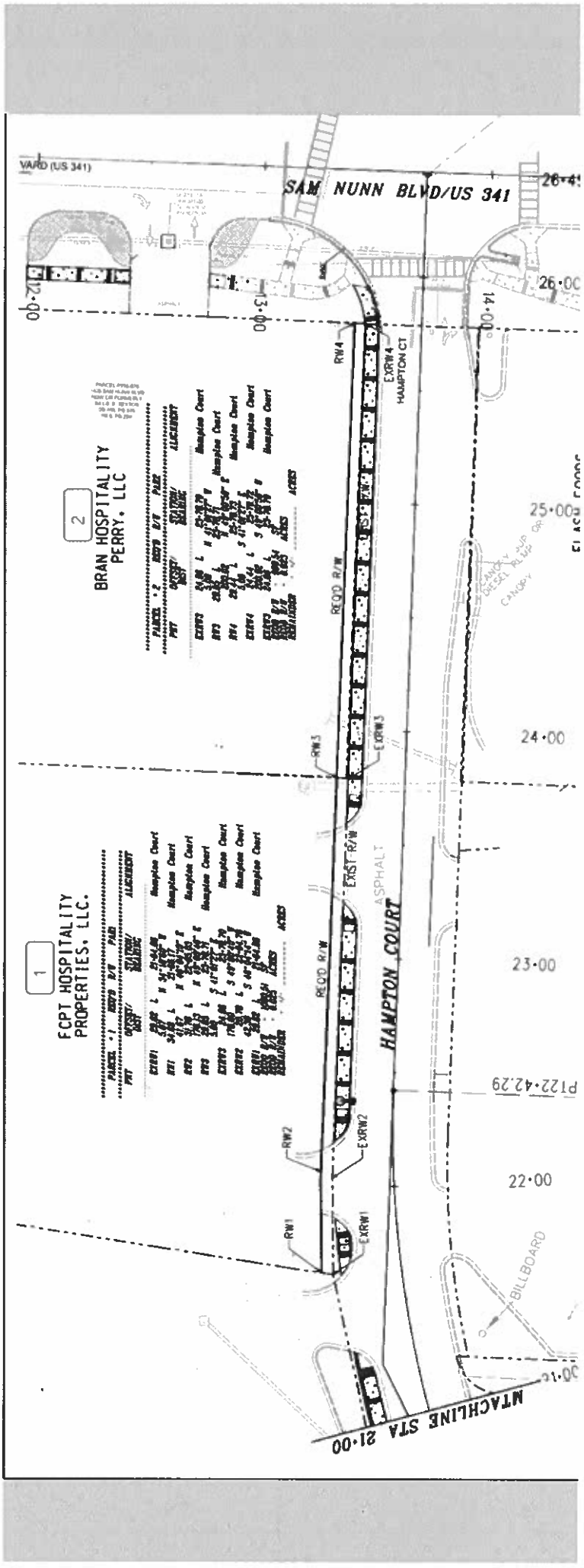
# Houston Lake Drive Sidewalk

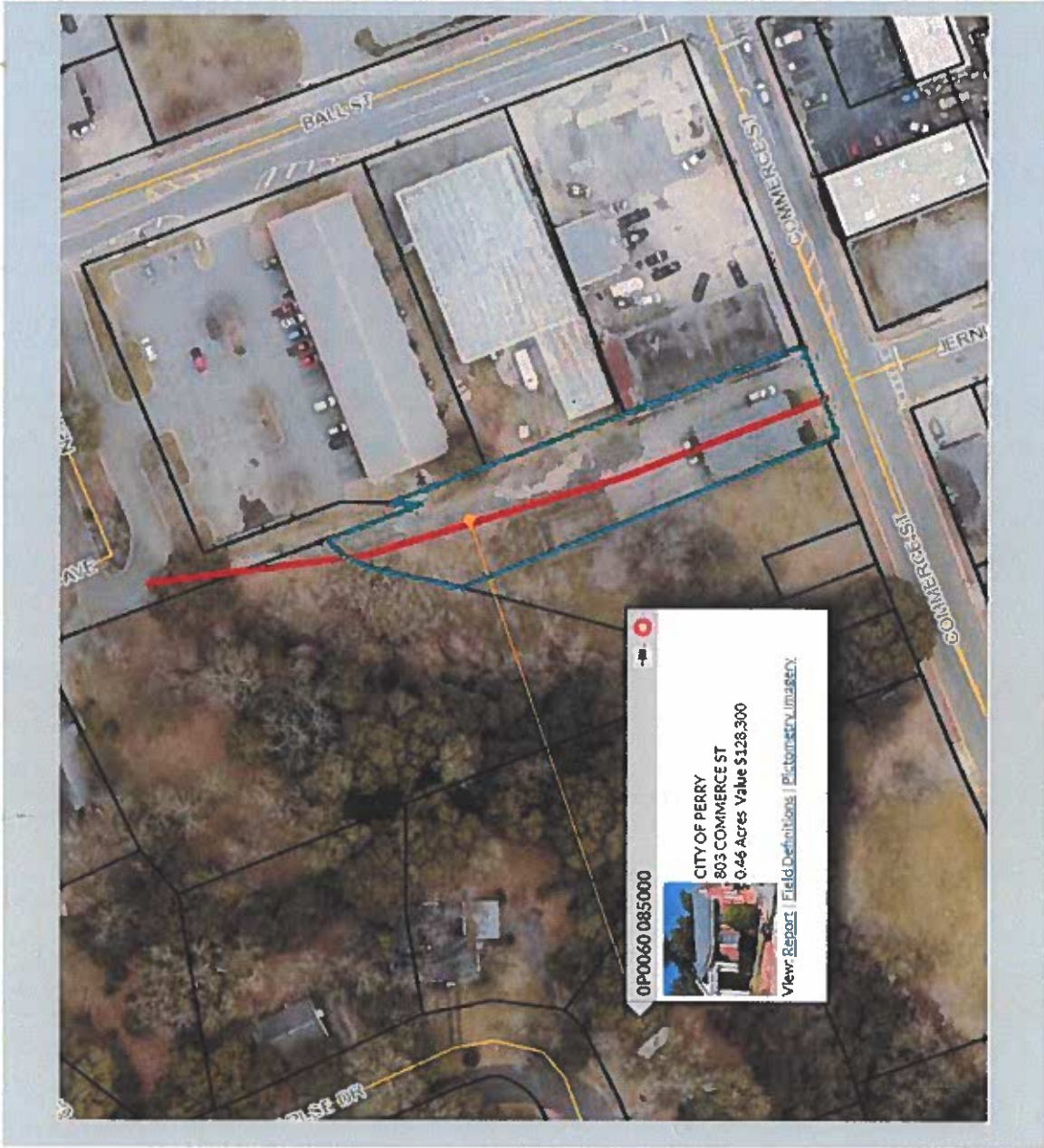
# Hampton Road Sidewalk

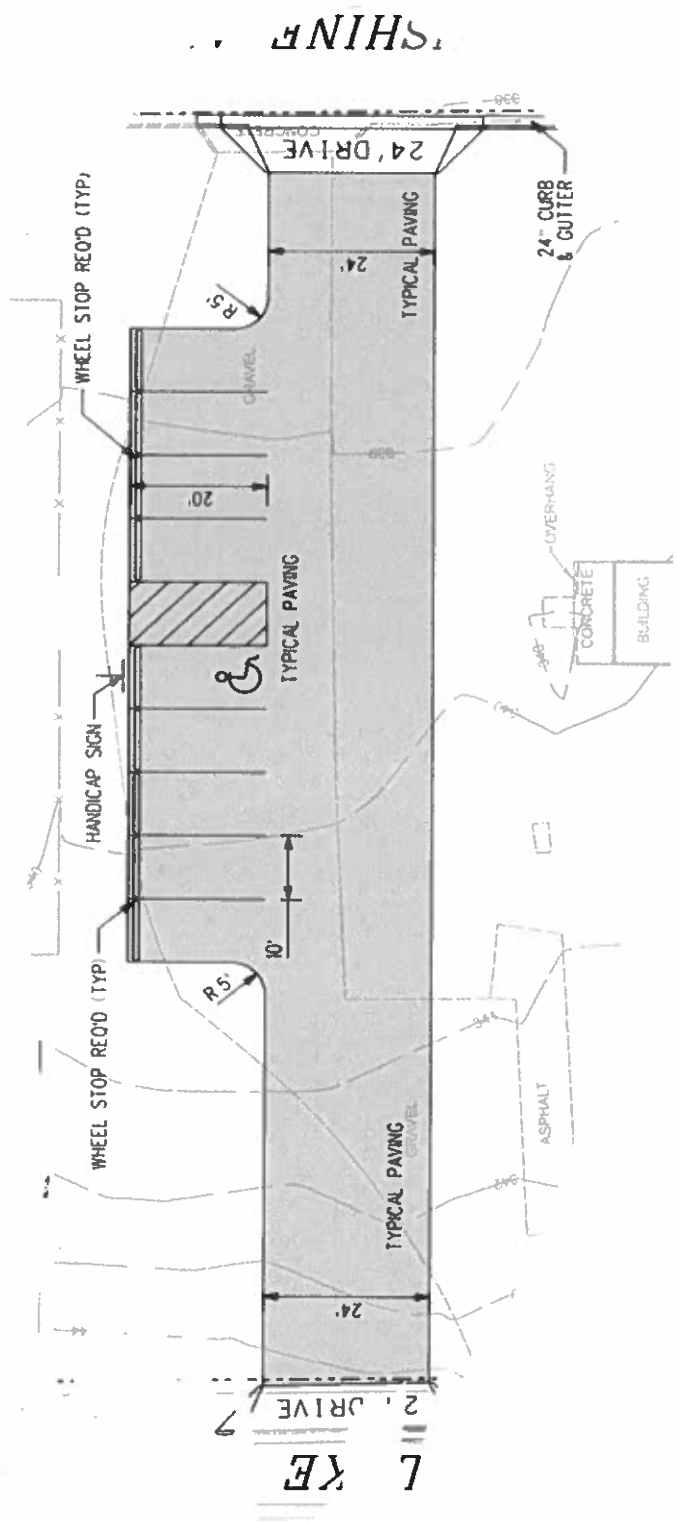
# Jernigan Street Extension

Rick Saunders has been tasked with designing alignment of Jernigan Street at the former City Hall location. Building is planned to be removed. Awaiting survey data.



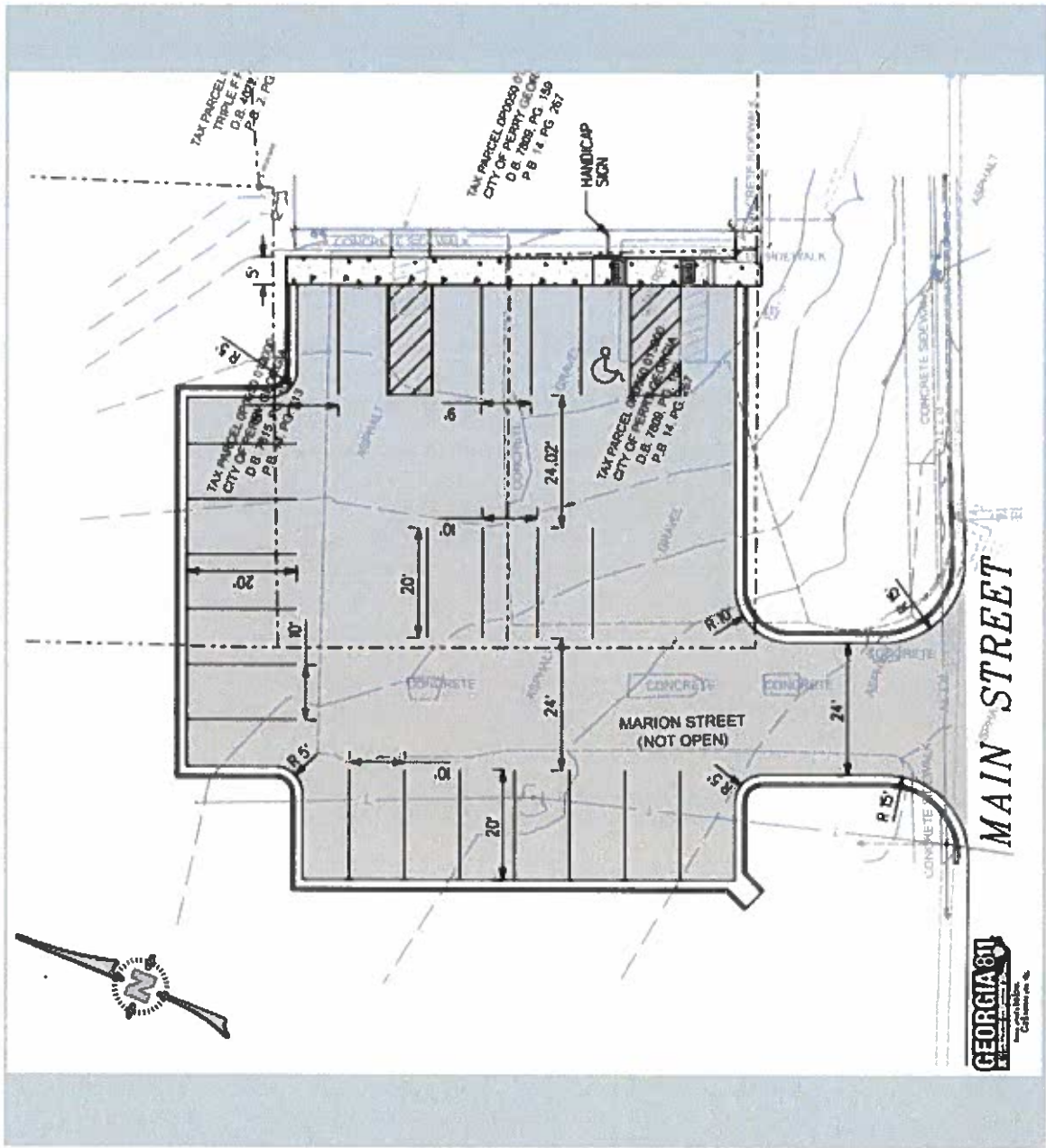

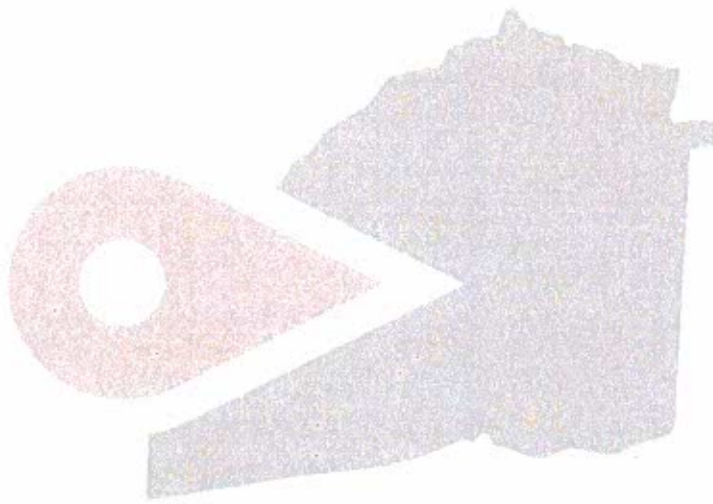

The City contacted our current solid waste collector for assistance in providing totters for our customers. The City has not been able to have its orders filled in a timely matter.

Waste Management responded back with a plan to purchase the City's totters for \$ 280,000 and provide totters as needed.

This is beneficial since:

1. Waste Management is able to obtain totters through bulk purchase and nationwide suppliers.
2. This will free up staff from having to track, deliver and pick up totters on a daily basis.

However, Waste Management also advised the City it will soon need to increase its monthly charge due to operating losses for the City account, rapid growth of customer base, equipment (new trucks) replacement/additional needs and labor costs. The proposed adjustments are listed in Exhibit "A".

**EXHIBIT "A"**

**SOLID WASTE COLLECTION /DISPOSAL COSTS**

Waste Management desires to address this issue soon. It understands if the City would like to bid the services.

The Administration recommends Council authorize:

1. Accepting of the Waste Management offer to take over totter provision and pay the City \$ 280.000 for its existing stock.
2. The City amend its contract with Waste Management to adjust for the new rates, annual adjustment factor and length of contract as allowed by state law.
3. The City uses its totter purchase money to cover the additional costs in contractor collection costs until it can phase in the additional costs.

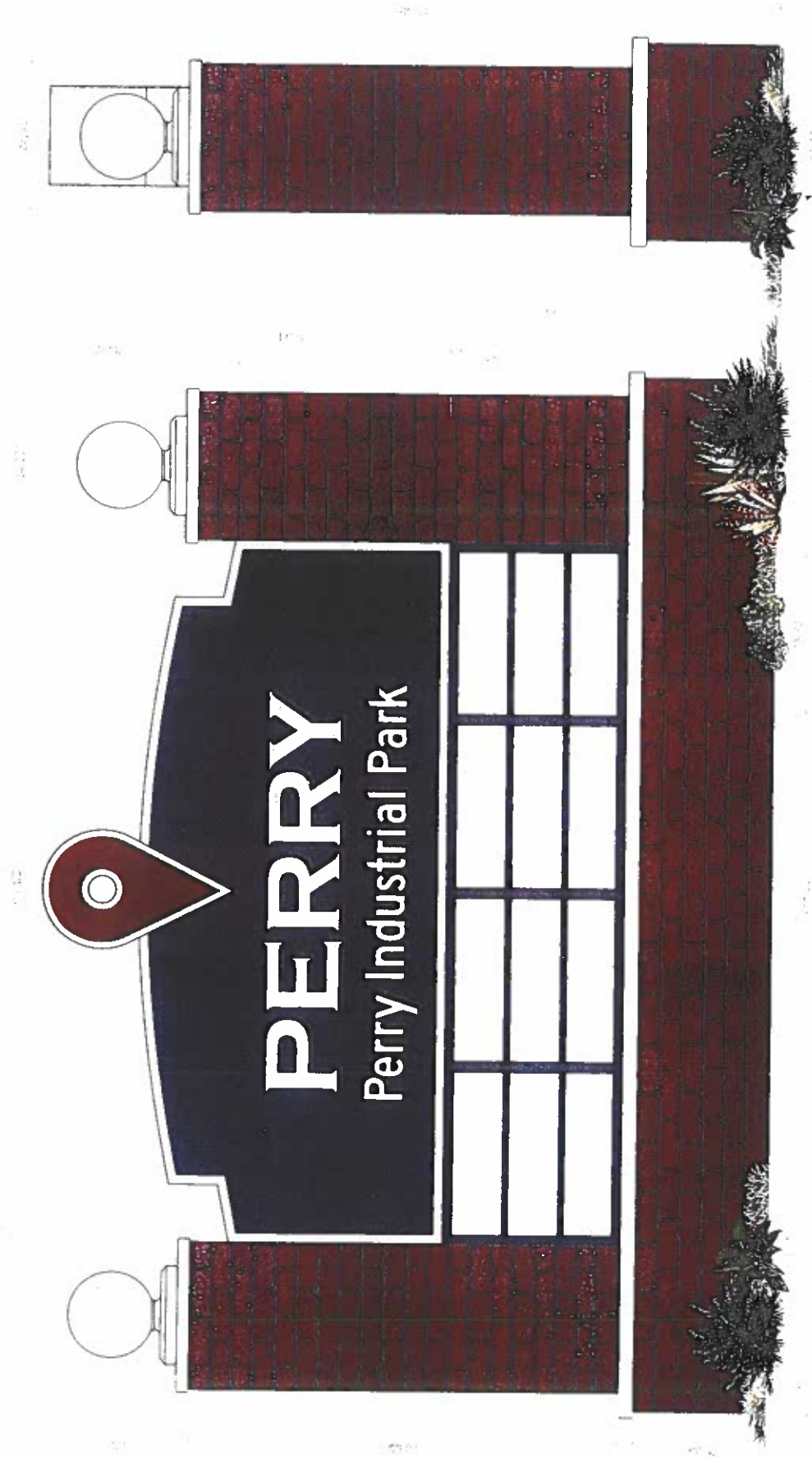
