REFERENCE: Disposal of assets

In 2016 the city purchased bitcoins for use in ransomware purchases. With the current security system in place the city is protected as well as possible.

The coin base account now has a value of approximately \$100,000. The Administration recommends council authorize the disposal of this asset and placing the proceeds in a restricted account to be used by the Downtown Development Authority of the City of Perry for new project financing.

RE: Options for Acquiring Pickup Trucks

This Council previously approved two additional positions in the Community Development department: one Code Compliance Specialist and one Building Inspector. Both positions require the use of a City Vehicle, and both were assigned “spare” trucks that, due to age and condition, should be declared surplus and disposed of.

Due to various supply chain issues related to the Covid-19 pandemic, soliciting bids for the purchase of new vehicles would result in a significant delay of up to 12 months in physically receiving new vehicles for these two positions. After checking with local dealers, Staff was advised by Phil Brannen Ford of Perry that they have two trucks on order from Ford that are scheduled to arrive in late April, 2022. Staff’s recommendation would be to purchase these vehicles from Phil Brannen Ford of Perry in the amount of \$37,176.00 per vehicle.
