REFERENCE:

Employee health insurance contributions

Investigating concerns expressed by employees participating in the city's health insurance program the Administration offers the following:

- 1. The city has always required employees to contribute to the city's health insurance program.
- 2. Originally the employees paid the administration costs. The city paid the claims.
- 3. As health insurance costs increased the city assumed more of the administration costs.
- 4. The Affordable Care Act restricted the employee contribution rate.
- 5. The city seeks to remain competitive in recruiting.

The attached Exhibit "A" outlines the city's health insurance program for FY 2021.

A survey of peer cities found that 70% charge the employee to participate all require contributing for family coverage.

The bracket of eligible employees is shown in chart A.

The average rates at the surveyed peer cities were \$ 47.93/employee only/pay period and \$ 202.71/family/pay period.

The Administration recommends council approve adjusting the employee contribution to approximate the peer average. Chart B outlines the recommendation.



Woodlawn Cemetery planning

With your concurrence to proceed with a legacy fund for Evergreen cemetery the Administration feels it is important to scale back the City's involvement in the cemetery business. All parcels have been sold in Evergreen cemetery.

The Administration recommends council approve the below future planning for Woodlawn cemetery.

- 1. The city will not expand the current cemetery parcel.
- 2. Ten percent (10.00%) of the remaining 319 unsold parcels (32) will be removed from the market and held in reserve for resolving existing plot conflicts, such as wrong burials, misidentified plots, etc.
- 3. The city shall continue to sell the remaining 287 as requested for one (1) year. After that date no further plots will be sold, and the remaining areas will be greenspace.
